Based in Central Florida, CECO empowers children and adults with neurological motor disabilities to achieve their greatest potential. Through transformative programs, CECO focuses on abilities rather than limitations, providing innovative educational services. Families often relocate to the Orlando area to access CECO's life-changing programs. At CECO, we believe that everyone is 'I'MPOSSIBLE', and we are committed to supporting our participants and their families on their journey to greater independence.

About Conductive Education

Conductive Education is a learning method for individuals with neurological motor disabilities, like but not limited to cerebral palsy, which integrates an intensive and motivating approach to the development of gross and fine motor skills, mobility and balance, flexibility and motion, social skills, communication, and speech.

CECO moved to Polytechnic University and enrolled 14 students and expanded into 4 classrooms occupying 2,500 sq. feet.

CECO hosted ACENA Conference and partners with Orlando Science Center for a Conductive Education Center Exhibit.

The first class graduated from the Conductor Training Program with 5 graduates. Conductor graduates hired by CECO allowed for growth and serving more students.

2019

An additional five graduated from the Conductor Training Program. CECO collaborated with Down Syndrome Foundation for conductive education programming.



2021

CECO celebrated 20 years! There were 36 students and 12 Adults enrolled. Over the past 20 years, CECO has served hundreds of children and adults and impacted thousands of families with their school day, adult and summer camp programs.



2024

CECO currently serves over 150 participants annually, with growing waitlists across all programs. In response to this demand, CECO is exploring opportunities for expansion.

CECO collaborated with Orange County Public Schools on an after school program and also worked with Full Sail University on an interactive technology ladder.

2020

Three new Conductors graduated from the Conductor Training Program.

CECO began virtual education and started the first of its kind Adult Conductive Education Program. CECO also expanded by adding an additional 2,500 sq. feet.



2023

CECO has 49 K-12 students, 17 adults, 25 full-time staff, 9 classrooms and 7 innovative programs. CECO also added an additional 3,000 sq feet. for a total of 18,000 sq feet.

CECO receives their 1st patent for their Interactive Technology Ladders.

OUR TRANSFORMATIONAL PROGRAMS

All of our programs are uniquely designed to incorporate the basics of conductive education into social, physical, cognitive, and everyday living activities.

SCHOOL DAY PROGRAM

The School Day Program incorporates CE and special education and is designed to address the overall needs of children and young adults with neurological motor disabilities.



YOUNG ADULT PROGRAM



The Young Adult Program is for individuals age 18 -22 with neurological motor disabilities focusing on improving daily living skills and enhancing independence.

ADULT DAY PROGRAM



The Adult Program focuses on the physical, cognitive, and socio-emotional development and improvement of daily living skills that the participant can apply to everyday situations.

INDIVIDUAL SESSIONS

Individual CE sessions addresses the individuals unique needs and is available to any child recommended for the CE program.



VIRTUAL SESSIONS

Virtual sessions involve individual, conductor, and family participating in online conductive education lessons.



YOUNGSTER PROGRAM

The Youngster program is designed to provide both parent and child with the tools and strategies to maximize their child's abilities



SUMMER CAMP

Summer Camp provides an intensive program for individuals with motor disabilities, like cerebral palsy, using CE to improve physical, social-emotional, and cognitive abilities.





IMPACT

- 80% of K-12 students showed improvement in fine and gross motor skill development.
- 100% of Adult Program participants increased their social interaction.
- 100% of the Youngster Program children improved their play skills.
- 100% of all participants increased the time they spend out of their wheelchairs, gaining greater strength and mobility.
- 100% of all participants improved their quality of life.
- Positively impacted thousands of families, friends and community members.



INNOVATION

- Three students proudly graduated from CECO's K-12 Program, with two seamlessly transitioning into the Adult Day Program where they continue to grow and thrive.
- CECO's Adult Day Program grew, welcoming more participants eager to build independence, friendships, and life skills.
- CECO welcomed a new Conductor from Hungary, strengthening our team.
- To better serve our growing student population, CECO expanded its ESE team, allowing us to create more personalized learning experiences. This growth also made it possible to introduce exciting STEAM activities, sparking curiosity and engagement in the classroom.
- Two dedicated CECO staff members reached a major milestone, successfully graduating from the University of Birmingham, England's, Conductor Training Program after two years of hard work and dedication.







CONNECTION

- 21 families relocated to Central Florida to give their child the opportunity to attend CECO.
- Selected to attend the Empowering Good program through the Edyth Bush Institute, strengthening our leadership and impact.
- Developed a specialized life skills program for the Downs Syndrome Association of Central Florida, helping their adult participants build essential life skills.
- 100% of families participating in the Youngster program gained greater knowledge about caring for a child with disabilities.
- Collaborated with community volunteer groups from organizations, service clubs and companies, as they engaged in meaningful projects to support our mission.

HOPE

- Provided financial assistance for 90% of our K-12 families through the Pete and Lynn DiPasqua Student Scholarship Fund.
- CECO remains dedicated to ensuring no family is turned away due to financial constraints, providing more than \$1.8 million in scholarships over the past 24 years.
- Raised \$1.86 million through fundraising, events, and capital campaign support - made possible by the incredible generosity of our donors, community, and their belief in our mission.
- Secured \$336,792 in awarded grants, allowing us to expand our programs and further empower our students and families.
- With growing waitlists for all programs, we are actively exploring opportunities for expansion, ensuring more individuals can benefit from conductive education.





Since starting the program, Melania has improved her mobility, her rolling, and is even learning to stand with a ladder. Before CECO, she had never used a gait trainer, but now she is pushing herself up and taking steps with assistance. She has also making great strides in independence - sitting at the table to feed herself with a spoon and successfully taking five bites with minimal help. Melania's journey is a testament to her determination and the lifechanging impact of CECO's programs. We can't wait to see all that she will continue to achieve!





Owen is a bright, hardworking, and friendly individual who brings energy and kindness to everyone around him. He warmly welcomes new friends, eagerly helps his classmates, and takes great pride in the connections he builds. His enthusiasm for learning and determination to improve his skills make him a true inspiration.

Since starting at CECO in 2024, Owen has already made remarkable progress in reading and math. He has transitioned from walking in a gait trainer to using a walker—and recently took six independent steps! His independence is also growing at mealtime, as he now scoops and takes bites of his food all on his own.

Owen's confidence shines in the classroom, where he knows the daily programs so well that he's practically leading the class. More than anything, he thrives when working with friends, motivating and uplifting those around him just as they do for him.



Alex McKay's journey with Conductive Education came full circle when he joined CECO's Adult Program in April 2024. Having participated in CE as a child in another state, Alex took a break for several years before returning- and his progress has been remarkable. He has gained strength, confidence, and independence. Alex loves using a standing frame and has improved both fine and gross motor skills. Socially, he has made new friends and communicates more effectively. His leadership skills also shine- his peers elected him President of CECO's Adult Program for 2025!

Since joining CECO in 2021, Brandt has made incredible strides in his mobility, independence, and communication. He has begun walking with a ladder-back chair, and within a month, he was holding onto it without arm braces. He has progressed from 10 steps to over 35 and by December he was able to separate his legs on his own. As Brandt's balance and strength grows, so does his independence.

Beyond physical progress, Brandt has improved both cognitively and socially. He is able to follow more complex instructions, articulate more and has begun vocalizing new sounds. His

determination and hard work continue to shine!



Since joining CECO's Adult Program in late 2023, Angelyn Gutierrez has made incredible strides in communication, mobility, and social engagement. As a Tobii ambassador, she now uses her communication device more effectively and loves creating presentations and engaging more with peers.

In mid-2024, Angelyn received her first gait trainer, which she loves using to walk around the building. Her mobility has improved significantly, and she has become more social, forming strong friendships within the program.
